Budget / Staffing

Allotted staffing has gone down every year - total of about 20 teacher positions lost in the four years of his tenure. We were at 105 teachers this year and during leveling we gained a teacher unit. We are looking at 104 for next year. We will do our best to mitigate any of that with attrition. For some we won't refill or reallot instead of hiring a full new person. Aim to meet campus needs during staffing - ESL population has grown from 180 students to 240. Gained 20 newcomers (any student this is the first 3 years in america) - need a lot of support. We have ½ ESL and ½ English but to support students we need a FTE ESL. We are able to make position moves to help our campus - trade a counselor position for a full time project specialist (504). Going to have a full time ESL FTE next year.

Will have two registrars next year- need to have an additional FTE with access in the system. With master scheduling changes and strategic elimination of certain sections it won't be too noticeable.

Kelly Allen

• Non Staffing Budget

Bookkeeper in charge of campus budgeting with Mary Elmore. Encouraged members to make appointments to look at the budget overall.

<u>All non staffing budget</u> - what Anderson turned in but not likely the final numbers, overview. For the most part we have the budget the same as next year. New finance software accounting system. Maintain budgets for departments. Note - \$30M cut for all of AISD not reflected and board may come through and slash budgets - we aren't sure if it will be 5-10%. Numbers are preliminary.

<u>Athletics</u> - allocated by district athletics department - rotate through teams, # of participants - district athletics funds across campuses..

Kelly will follow up on the question: Why can't the public see the preliminary budget?

<u>CTE</u> Seems like a low budget but has additional funding from federal grants. Perkins is a federal grant which allows CTE to plan in the spring - to make purchases in the fall - programs that are part of our curriculum, tech, PCs etc.

Program / Supplemental funding

Where special programs get funding - fine arts allocation from the district. Activity fund falls under Mary Elmore through student fees (it is what is generated throughout the year).

True taxpayer money is this budget - allocated from district and school,

IB funding was cut by 25% - covers teacher training, software - have talked about an alumni organization

Total budget of \$550K.

<u>College Career and Military Readiness</u> - has been cut - push for the district and for the school. In order to be considered college ready, must take the TSI test (Texas Success Initiative) or 480 SAT / 510 verbal. This designation allows students to register for college have to be ready by testing along with enrollment

Overall the AISD Board of trustees has said they will look to cut the budget by: Looking at contracts, Looking at software they use, Staffing and other efficiency - central office

Tomorrow is a voting meeting for the board of trustees - can watch the meetings over youtube

- <u>Choice Sheets, Scheduling, Master Schedule, Staffing, Hiring</u> Optimistic about budgeting and work we have done that we are still able to meet needs of the student population
- <u>New Assistant Principal</u> Hired a new AP : will be in charge of the AP tests (campus testing coordinator) Natalie Adams will be 9th grade AP next year.
- <u>Senior Finals May 14 17</u> During finals week have attendance activities - elementary school walk, MS walk, graduation practice chromebook turn in
- <u>Campus/Classroom Late Work Policies</u> Grading policy and late work policy - academy director - Dr. Jesse Molina will be working on this over the summer. In general should be aligned by department and will work on alignment by department, should be aligned by section.
- <u>Testing</u>-TELPAS-finished (Shackelford), TSI-ongoing (Spencer), EOC-Finished (Molina), AP and IB in May

EOC completed, will look at boot camp. Will do better at communications - did a good job with staff but need to focus on communication to students.

- <u>Campus Architectural Team (CAT)</u>

 Community meeting has happened, just had CAT Meeting #12. Arboreal study heritage trees that will need to be moved or protected. CAT meetings are open to the public next on May 20th. 1880 students will fit in the new gym.
- <u>Areas of Focus–What are we talking about this summer? Refining systems.</u> Student IDs - Is the policy punitive? Is there an incentive to be dishonest? Looking at the policy to make sure we are a safe and secure campus.
