### In Pursuit of Excellence

Anderson High School strives to provide a comprehensive educational experience that is high quality, challenging, and inspires all students to make a positive contribution to society.

Located in northwest Austin, L.C. Anderson serves a diverse population, with more than 50 different languages spoken in students' homes. Highly experienced teachers and administrators offer a challenging and enriching academic experience and a wide range of extracurricular activities.

Since 1991, Anderson High School has been authorized as an International Baccalaureate school. IB is a comprehensive curriculum to challenge highly motivated high school students by focusing on higher-level learning skills, creative thinking, interdisciplinary studies and community service with an international perspective on learning.

Anderson has been named a T-STEM academy by the Texas Education Agency. Anderson's career and technology programs highlight medical, engineering, film, manufacturing and computer science. The Applied Technology Center provides a facility for students from area schools to work on science, technology, engineering and math projects, such as robotics.

U.S. News and World Report and the Daily Beast have named Anderson as one of the Top High Schools in the Nation, the highest rank for any comprehensive Austin ISD high school.

#### **Covid-19 Implications**

On April 6, 2020, the Board of Trustees for Austin ISD decided that in order to ensure fair and consistent grading for all students, the existing local policy would be temporarily adjusted. The temporary modifications to Board Policy include the following:

- 1. For all classes that began during the Spring Semester of the 2019-2020 school year, student grades were recorded and reported as pass or incomplete. Numerical grades were not given.
- 2. Final class rank for the 2020 school year was calculated as of 12/19/2019. No new class rank was issued at the end of the school year.

#### Athletics/Fine Arts

Anderson High School participates in Division 5A with varsity competition in football, baseball, golf, tennis, basketball, volleyball, track, cross country, swimming, wrestling, soccer, and softball. The extensive Fine Arts program includes art, band, orchestra, guitar, choir, theater, and dance.

## Student Organizations

Anderson High School offers over 50 co-curricular programs including academic clubs, honor societies, performing arts organizations, community service organizations, special interest clubs, spirit groups and water polo club.

### **Rank Policy**

L. C. Anderson is a non-ranking school. Pursuant to Texas Education Code Section 51-803, class rank will only be provided to Texas public universities/colleges for students in the top ten percent.

## **Grading Scale/GPA**

Anderson uses a weighted 4.0 scale. Course designations of "Q/H" (Pre-AP/Honors), "N" (Dual Credit), "P" (Advanced Placement) or "I" (International Baccalaureate) are considered honors and receive weighted grade points. For example:

### **Graduation Requirements**

L.C. Anderson students graduate under the Foundations Plan (22 credits) or the Foundations Plan with Endorsement (26 credits). Endorsements are offered in the following areas: Multidisciplinary Studies, Arts and Humanities, Public Services, STEM, and Business and Industry. Additionally, students can graduate with a Distinguished Level of Achievement (indicating completion of four years of study in the four core areas, including Algebra 2, as well as completion of at least one endorsement). Students can also earn Performance Acknowledgements for AP/SAT/ACT scores, college credit earned in high school, bilingualism, and industry certifications or credentials. Below are the credits required for graduation under the Foundations Plan with Endorsement.
