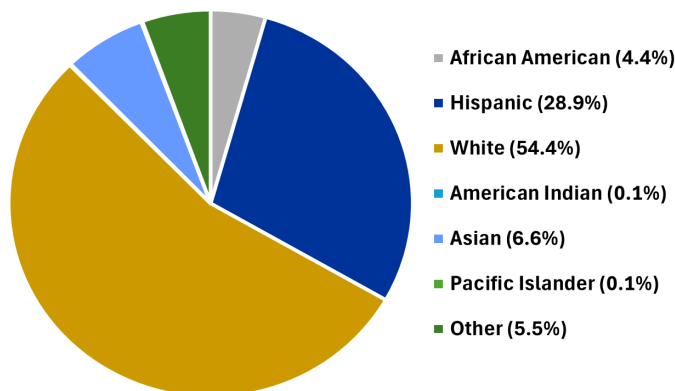
Extra-Curriculars
